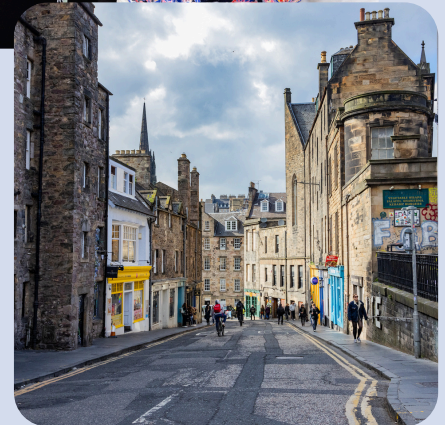

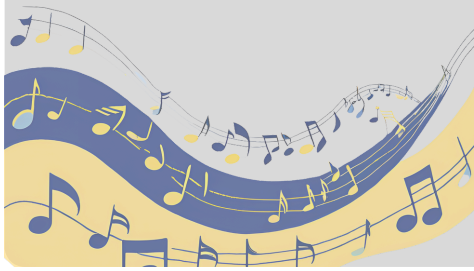

### Joshua Arizmendi (B.A. MUS '25)

Composer and lyricist of new musical *Wake Up*, premiering at SCSU on October 25.

## Faculty Spotlight

Hailing from Orange, CT, Ryan Sands has become one of the top young drummers in his field. His emphatic performances have landed him appearances with Terell Stafford, Geoffrey Keezer, Wayne Escoffrey, Tamir Hendleman, Lucy Yeghiazaryan, and Jason Marsalis.



Ryan's musical education includes a BA in Jazz Performance from the New England Conservatory and an MA in Jazz Arts from the Manhattan School of Music. He has taught for Neighborhood Music School in New Haven, CT and iSchool of Music and Art in Shanghai. He currently teaches private drums at Yale University for their Yale Undergrad Jazz Collective.

He holds the drum chair for Christian Sands and Altus. Ryan's recording credits include Christian Sands' *Risin'*, *Christmas Stories*, and an upcoming record in 2024, Altus' *Riot Cycles* and *Mythos*, David Knowles' *Blackest Night*, and Shihai Li's *Inner Rhythm*. As a bandleader Ryan's debut record was *Standing On the Edge of Tomorrow*; he will be releasing his sophomore record, *Arrival: Live at the Side Door*, in 2024.
